Come si ricorderà, con provvedimento n. 203 dell'11 maggio u.s. si comunicava alla Giunta camerale della visita alla Città di Genova da parte di una delegazione istituzionale di Misurata.

Nell'ambito di tale occasione, la Camera di Commercio di Genova ha promosso l'incontro istituzionale "Genova - Misurata Free Zone", finalizzato a presentare alla delegazione libica le eccellenze del sistema marittimo, portuale e logistico genovese, riconosciuto tra i principali hub del Mediterraneo per competenze, innovazione e capacità di integrazione tra istituzioni, imprese, università e ricerca, riunendo così i principali attori del cluster genovese ed offrendo un'occasione di confronto sulle sfide e le opportunità che interessano il settore portuale e logistico, con particolare attenzione alla digitalizzazione, alla sostenibilità, all'innovazione tecnologica e allo sviluppo delle competenze.

Nel corso dell'incontro è emersa la comune volontà di rafforzare il dialogo e la cooperazione tra Genova e Misurata, concretizzando tale intento dalla predisposizione di un Protocollo d'Intesa generico (in allegato).

Collaboration Agreement

Between

Misurata Chamber of Commerce, Industry & Agriculture

And

Genoa Chamber of Commerce

**On Strengthening Investment and Business Prospects
between the Two Countries**

This Agreement was signed on **Tuesday, the 9th of June 2026** in (Genova - Italy) by and between:

Preamble

In order to strengthen the neighbor countries ties existing between Italy and the State of Libya, and in order to develop and strengthen economic and trade relations between the two countries, support investment and exchange economic and commercial information, and within the framework of contributing to the joining of bilateral relations between businessmen in both countries, the two following parties:

Joint Commitment

Hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties", both Chambers commit to strengthening commercial and industrial ties, fostering bilateral relations, and promoting friendly and mutually beneficial cooperation among their business communities. The Parties shall endeavor to advance collaboration in trade, investment, technology transfer, services, and industry sectors.

Both Parties agreed to the following:

Article (1)

The preamble set forth above forms an integral part of this Agreement and complements its provisions.

Article (2)

The Parties shall collaborate closely and exert every effort to strengthen their relationship through the exchange of expertise, economic, commercial, and investment information, as well as any other areas beneficial to their members.

Article (3)

Neither Party shall assign or delegate to any third party the responsibilities outlined in this Agreement or any of its articles, whether directly or indirectly, without the prior written consent of the other Party.

Article (4)

The Parties shall make every effort to share relevant market insights concerning their respective countries, including principles, laws, and policies underpinning their trade and investment frameworks, with the aim of maximizing mutual benefits.

Article (5)

The Parties shall endeavor to provide information regarding diverse investment sectors in both countries, as follows:

1. The two Parties will collaborate to enhance investment opportunities for the private sector on both fronts, facilitating this by exchanging related information on economic development within their respective countries to foster increased commercial cooperation and extend avenues for economic and industrial collaboration among relevant institutions and organizations, all in accordance with the applicable legislation in both countries.
2. The two Parties shall offer the necessary support and facilities for trade and economic delegations visiting both countries and extend all forms of assistance to facilitate effective communication channels between businesses.
3. The two Parties collaborate to coordinate virtual events that aim to benefit the business sectors in both countries.
4. The two Parties are dedicated to advancing the interests of their respective members, actively exchanging information and updates on local legislation governing foreign trade and investment.
5. The two Parties aim to facilitate trade and investment activities, either independently or collaboratively, with the institutions of the other Party.
6. Each Party shall provide the other Party with all necessary information and forms of support to enable institutions, organizations, and companies to participate in local and international exhibitions, specialized exhibitions, economic and technical forums, seminars, conferences, and other relevant events, with the aim of widening opportunities for economic cooperation.
7. The two Parties will pay effort to promote shared commercial interests and identify any challenges or obstacles hindering the development of trade and economic ties between them.
8. The two Parties endorse and promote the exchange of expertise, technical knowledge, and training opportunities among the relevant institutions in both countries.
9. Both Parties shall incorporate any additional areas not mentioned herein into separate appendices upon mutual agreement.

Article (6)

In addition, both Parties shall cooperate, to the extent possible, in organizing exhibitions and seminars — either jointly or individually — for Italian companies in Libya and for Libyan companies in Italy, with the aim of promoting mutual business opportunities and strengthening bilateral economic ties and undertaking any other necessary activities to advance the objectives of this Agreement.

Article (7)

The Parties shall exchange information and facilitate participation in major international exhibitions and business events hosted in their respective countries to promote bilateral trade and services regionally. Each Party shall assist the other in participating in such exhibitions, trade missions, visits, and related activities under this Agreement.

Article (8)

The Parties shall convene meetings as necessary to deliberate on matters of mutual interest and to design programs for upcoming activities and events.

Article (9)

Both Parties acknowledge and agree that this Agreement does not impose any financial or funding obligations on either Party.

Each Party shall bear the costs and expenses associated with its participation in the activities outlined herein, unless otherwise mutually agreed.

Article (10)

This Agreement shall remain in force for a period of two years from the date of signing, and shall be automatically renewed for similar periods unless either Party notifies the other in writing of its intention not to renew, at least three months prior to the expiration of the original or renewed term. Termination or expiration of this Agreement shall not impede the implementation or completion of any ongoing work, which shall continue until finalized in accordance with the provisions herein.

Article (11)

Norther Party shall have the right or authority to assign or transfer this Agreement or any obligations undertaken herein to a third party without the prior written consent of the other Party.

Article (12)

Any amendments to this Agreement shall require written notification by one Party to the other, followed by written approval of the proposed amendments.

Article (13)

Each Party shall respect the intellectual and literary property rights of the other, including trademarks and logos, and shall refrain from any infringement thereof. Neither Party may use the name or trademark of the other without prior written consent.

Article (14)

The Parties shall maintain the confidentiality of all data, information, and documents exchanged between them. Such materials shall not be used for purposes other than those outlined in this Agreement without prior written approval. This obligation shall remain in effect throughout the validity of the Agreement and, upon its expiration or termination; both Parties shall take all necessary precautions to safeguard confidentiality.

Article (15)

In the event of a dispute, the Parties shall endeavor to resolve it amicably. Should an amicable resolution prove unattainable, the Parties shall seek arbitration through an international arbitration body agreed upon mutually.
